



## Multi-skilled Health Technician

### ■ What Is a Multi-skilled Health Technician?

Multi-skilled health technicians are allied health professionals who are cross trained to provide more than one function, often in more than one discipline. In addition to offering specialized training opportunities, this associate degree program gives you foundational knowledge in science, patient management, computer skills and communication that is required of all allied health professionals.

### ■ Success Factors

You need a high level of concern for the well-being of others, cultural sensitivity, and the ability to communicate well. You should be detail orientated, dedicated, and responsible as well as have a high degree of tolerance for blood, other bodily fluids and odors.

### ■ Career Possibilities

With skills to perform more than one occupational role, multi-skilled health technicians are highly marketable. Graduates may find themselves working in a variety of environments including:

- Acute care hospitals
- Sub-acute care centers
- Physician's offices
- Urgent care centers
- Community health care centers
- Health maintenance organizations
- Long-term care facilities

### ■ Majoring In Multi-skilled Health Technology

This program features a flexible curriculum that meets the rapidly changing needs of the health community and the helping professions. It will prepare you with skills in more than one discipline, allowing you to better meet the needs of patients and the health care system. You will work with an advisor to tailor a degree highlighting your skills and interests, and give you multiple competencies to take to the workplace.

You will complete 45 hours of general education, including solid grounding in math and oral and written communication, and a core of 23 hours of technical courses. You may choose from a variety of options, with concentrations in gerontology, direct patient care, medical assisting, and others. When you complete the program, you will be eligible for national and/or state certification in several areas.

You should be able to complete this program in 2 years, attending full-time fall, winter and spring quarters. If you graduated in allied health from a tech prep high school program, you may be granted college credits and advanced standing. This program is career specific and does not generally transition into a bachelor's degree.

## ■ Program Requirements

You and your advisor will plan a detailed curriculum to meet your specific health career requirements.

You should check with your academic advisor every quarter *before* you register for classes. Two years is really a short time to squeeze in all of your degree requirements. We cannot offer every course every quarter. If you miss taking a prerequisite for a required course, or don't take a particular course the only quarter it is offered during the year, you can jeopardize your ability to complete your degree on time.
