



Urban Professions

■ What Is an Urban Professional?

Urban professionals work for cities or metropolitan regions planning, designing, managing and operating public services. They also plan for effective use and protection of public resources. Parks, mass transit, disaster preparation, zoning, recreational facilities, and city governance all fall within their scope.

This program provides you with the first 2 years toward completion of a bachelor's degree in urban planning or urban studies.

■ Success Factors

You must be able to frequently attend evening or weekend meetings or public hearings with citizens' groups. You should be able to work under the pressure of deadlines and tight work schedules, as well as political pressure generated by interest groups affected by proposals related to urban development and land use.

You must be able to think in terms of spatial relationships and visualize the effects of your plans and designs. You should be flexible and be able to reconcile different viewpoints and make constructive policy recommendations. The ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing, is necessary for anyone interested in this field.

■ Career Possibilities

Careers in the urban professions cover a wide variety of opportunities in both the public and private sectors—from city managers to transit authority managers, from grant writers to emergency planners to hospital administrators—careers to which you are hired, appointed or elected! As cities grow so do your opportunities, and not just locally. Demand in the urban professions is worldwide.

■ Majoring In Urban Professions

Our Urban Professions program offers the first 2 years of study for those who expect to transfer to baccalaureate programs in such areas of professional services as urban studies, urban planning, and health services administration. These programs are offered in the School of Planning at University of Cincinnati College of Design, Architecture, Art, and Planning as well as at other institutions.

You should be able to complete this program in 2 years, attending full-time fall, winter and spring quarters. You will need another 2 years of full-time study to complete your bachelor's degree.

■ Program Requirements

You should check with your academic advisor every quarter *before* you register for classes. Two years is really a short time to squeeze in all of your degree requirements. We cannot offer every course every quarter. If you miss taking a prerequisite for a required course, or don't take a particular course the only quarter it is offered during the year, you can jeopardize your ability to complete your degree on time.
